1. Amy Wistreich presented Item #1. Kevin Christie made one revision for Item #6 to change the vote from "30-0" TO "3-0". Upon motion by Amy Wistreich, seconded by Kevin Christie, and passing by a vote of 3-0, it was,

RESOLVED, that the minutes of the Board of Selectmen's and Water Pollution Control Authority's meetings of March 11, 2026 are hereby APPROVED.

APPROVE SUPPLEMENTAL SANITARY SEWER REQUEST AT 10 AMBLER ROAD WEST

2. WPCA General Manager Bryan Thompson presented WPCA Item #2 (BOS Item #10) Upon motion by Amy Wistreich, seconded by Kevin Christie, and passing by a vote of 3-0, it was:

RESOLVED, that the supplemental sanitary sewer connection request for the property at #10 Ambler Road West, contingent upon compliance with the WPCA General Manager's letter of March 18, 2026, is hereby APPROVED.

3. WPCA General Manager Bryan Thompson presented WPCA Item #3 (BOS Item #11) Upon motion by Amy Wistreich, seconded by Kevin Christie, and passing by a vote of 3-0, it was:

RESOLVED, that the supplemental sanitary sewer connection request for the property at #218 Hillspoint Road, contingent upon compliance with the WPCA General Manager's letter of March 18, 2026, is hereby APPROVED.

APPROVE FINAL BENEFIT ASSESSMENTS FOR CONTRACT 75

4. WPCA General Manager Bryan Thompson presented WPCA Item #4 (BOS Item #12). Mr. Thompson provided a detailed explanation of the petition process, including the extended timeline for the petition and the public meetings and interactions with the affected homeowners. Mr. Thomspson gave a breakdown of the costs associated with the project and the cost per unit assigned to each property. Upon motion by Amy Wistreich, seconded by Kevin Christie, and passing by a vote of 3-0, it was:

RESOLVED, that in accordance with Chapter 103, C.G.S. §7-245, et. seq., the final benefit assessment(s) to be levied for the design, construction, and construction oversight of the sewer system (Contract No. 75, Town Bid 23-068T) affecting properties located in all or part of the following areas:

Evergreen Avenue, Evergreen Parkway, Tamarac Road, Lone Pine Lane, Gorham Avenue, Compo Road North and Brookside Drive.

Is hereby APPROVED.
